National forest policies: stable but diverse forests





Next 100 years:

- □ Positive growth even in case of temparature increase
- High diversity of forests,based on SFM tradition

National forest policy: forest owners as driving forces



□ Alternative scenarios of SFM

(+- Timber, +-Biodiversity, +- Recreation)

□ Legaly-based decision of public and private owners

> Public and private forest owners as drivers of SFM

National forest-related policies: Disturbances by ecological bias



- □ Ecological priority increases probability for biotic and abiotic disturbances (beetle, storm and fire)
- □ Public discourse is not aware of these disturbances
- > SFM prevents disturbances by ecological bias

EU forest policy:Subsidiarity and national expertise



- □ Engagement of private and state actors does not indicate striving towards comprehensive EU regulation of SFM
- ☐ High potential of national research institutions for handling specific SFM problems
- ➤ Unfolding EU forest policy potentials by mobilized subsidiarity and networking of national research expertise

EU forest-related policies: Limits by SFM



□ Policies aiming to maximise CO2 sequestration, bioenergy and biodiversity are threatening to bounce SFM

□ Enlarging protected areas could increase timber imports

> SFM needs limits for EU to prevent passing on economic and ecological problems to the forests

International forest regime complex: Customizing for SFM



- ☐ Mostly symbolic "global face" of international forest regime complex (UNFF, UN-CBD, UN-FCCC)
- □ Options of support by international discourses and actors
- > Professional customizing of international forest regimes for national SFM
