



ECOFARMS Panama

ECOFARMS Panama (EF Panama) is a Panamanian non-profit organization that promotes the conservation and restoration of the tropical rainforests of the Mamoni river in Panama, through the development and application of sustainable land use systems.

The organization receives valuable support from the German forestry sector in the form of technical assistance, transfer of knowledge and capacity building. In more detail, land is managed using German forestry practices as well as students from different German universities conduct their research and internship semesters at ECOFARMS Panama's fields.

Support mechanisms for smallholder forest-owners in Panama

Private and public support in the development of forest ownership schemes is essential to reduce deforestation in the tropics. The current legislation promotes large-scale forest plantations; however, it neglects the role of small-scale forest owners.

In this sense, partnerships with the private sector provide small-scale forest owners with the opportunity to profit from maintaining and creating forest. For example, strategic alliances between EF Panama, German experts and the Panamanian energy sector have resulted in the establishment of the Mamoni River Reforestation Project. The aim is to restore areas currently under cattle farming pastures into productive ecosystems that balance food production and biodiversity protection.
